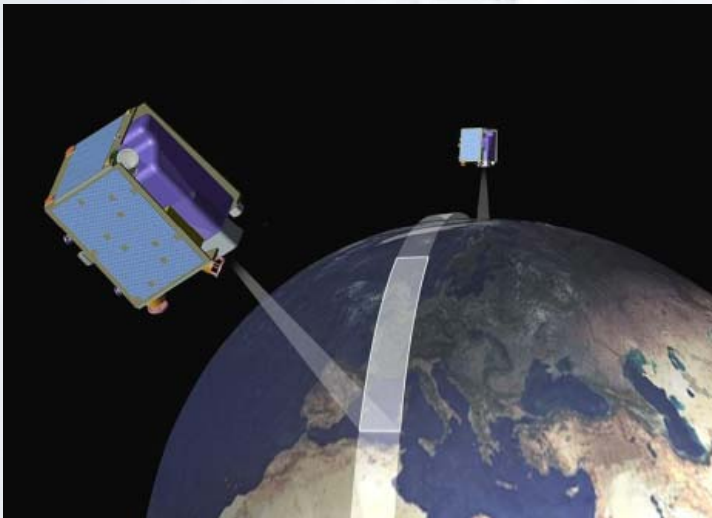

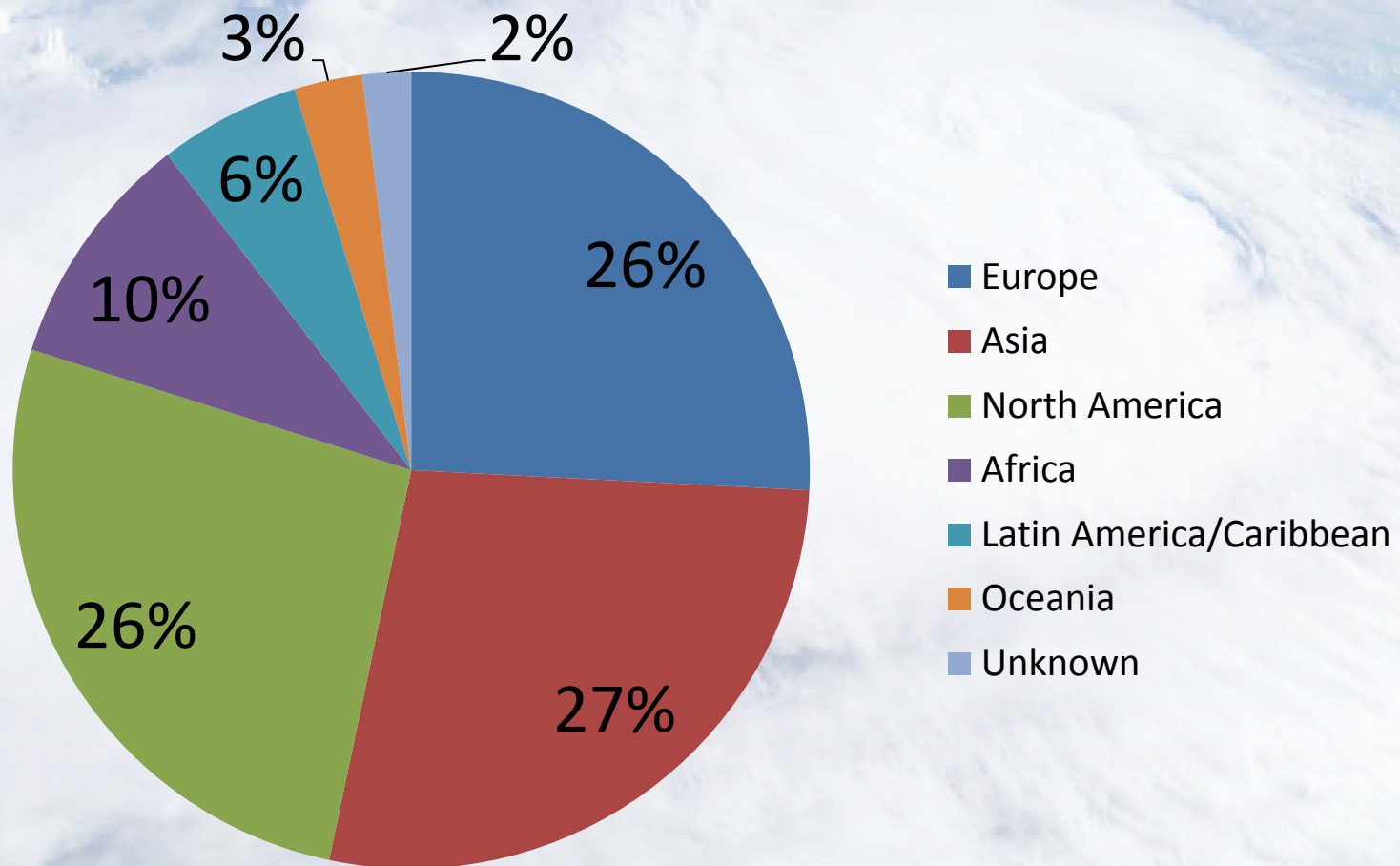

July 2009 – January 2014

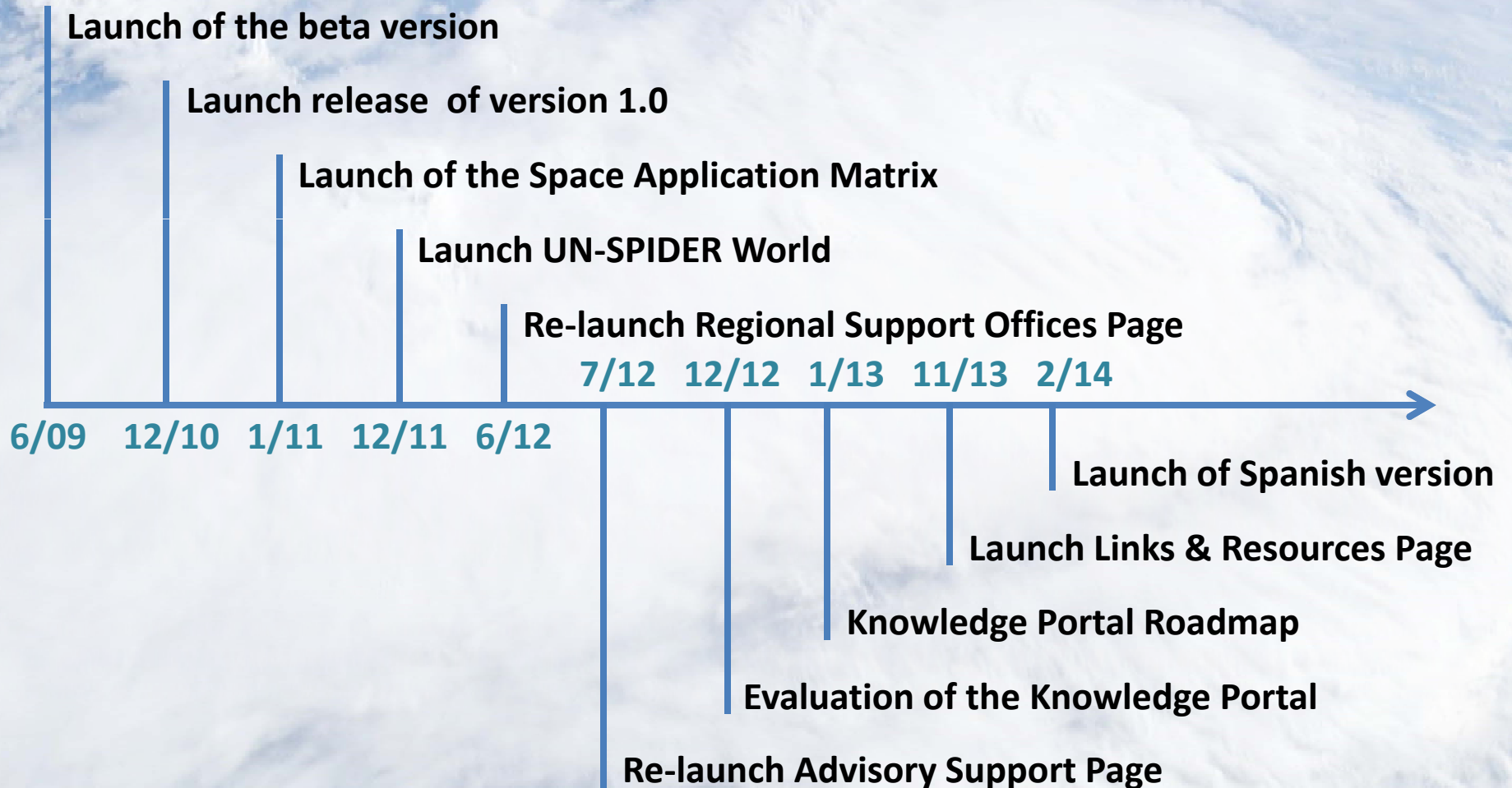
