

Summary and Outlook

[see also OOSA Report (A/AC.105/1204 of 14 December 2018)]

- I. HLF2018 bridged the formal intergovernmental COPUOS sessions with intersessional dialogue encompassing the broader space community; fostering exchange among the non-governmental sector, private actors and academia.
 - ➤ UNISPACE+50 RES 73/6: Emphasizing the need to build stronger partnerships and international cooperation and coordination ... at all levels and among the participants representing the space community, in order to enhance the contribution of space activities for the realization of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development ...; acknowledges the importance of global partnership and strengthened cooperation among Member States, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, industry and private sector entities in fulfilling the "Space2030" agenda and its implementation plan...
- II. Organisation of HLF2018 provided the host country with an excellent chance to raise awareness on the benefits of space, to mobilize its space community and involve new actors from the non-space sector.
