THIRD UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON THE EXPLORATION AND PEACEFUL USES OF OUTER SPACE

The Space Millennium: Vienna Declaration on Space and Human Development The States participating in the Third United Nations Conference on the Exploration and Peaceful Uses

The States participating in the Thira United Patitons Conjerence of Outer Space (UNISPACE III), held in Vienna from 19 to 30 July 1999,

be based on preparatory work carried out by the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer rticipation of representatives of all Member States, and the specialized agencies of the United

Recognize that the promotion of bilateral, regional and international cooperation in the field of a space must be guided by General Assembly resolution 51/122;

II

Recalling that 4 October 1957 was the date of the launch into outer space of the first human-made Earth satellite, Sputnik I, thus opening the way for space exploration,

Recalling also that 10 October 1967 was the date of the entry into force of the Treaty on Principles Governing the Activities of States in the Exploration and Use of Outer Space, including the Moon and Other

Decide, in order to contribute to the achievement of the objectives of UNISPACE III, in particular that of increasing awareness among decision makers and civil society of the benefits of the peaceful uses of space science and technology for sustainable development, to invite the General Assembly to declare, according to its procedures, "World Space Week" between 4 and 10 October for the yearly celebration at the international level of the contribution that space science and technology can make to the betterment of the human condition

World Space Week 2016


- Number of events
