Letter dated 18 May 1964 from the Acting Representative of the  
United States of America addressed to the Secretary-General

In accordance with the provision of Part B, paragraphs 1 and 2, of United Nations General Assembly resolution 1721 (XVI), I enclose registration data concerning objects launched into orbit or beyond by the United States. With these additions and deletions to the record Your Excellency will have received for the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space and for the Public Registry a complete registry of all United States space vehicles in orbit or beyond as of 31 March 1964.

In addition there is included supplemental information concerning United States space vehicles which were launched on 19 March and 24 March but which did not achieve orbit.
