



# Timeline of Space Activities in Mexico

1944

Begin in Mexico the space physics studies.

1957

The Mexican Government promotes the development of rockets for research purpose. 1960

Launch of the Tonatiuh Rocket Installation of a tracking station in Guaymas, Sonora. 1962

Creation of the National Commission of Outer Space. 1967

Was launched the 1st satelite of the Mit series. 1975

Was launched the 2nd of the Mit series. 1985

Was launched the Morelos 1 from Cabo Cañaveral, through the Discovery Shuttle.

1949

Integrates a group of Mexican tecnicians pioneers of rockety studies. 1959

Mexico integrantes along with 23 countries the Comission of the usage of outer sapace.

1961

UNAM provides the degree of air law. 1966

Mexico becomes a member of INTELSAT 1968

Was buit the first earth station, Tulancingo I, the biggest antenna in the world.

1979


Start the produces to acquire geostationary orbital positions


