

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, Cuba, Greece, the Russian Federation and the United Kingdom.

The Director of the Office for Outer Space Affairs also made a statement.

### Status and application of the five United Nations treaties on outer space [5]

The Subcommittee suspended its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Egypt on behalf of the the Group of 77 and China, Brazil, Indonesia and the Russian Federation.

General exchange of views on the legal aspects of space traffic management [12]

The Subcommittee concluded its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Brazil, Egypt, Japan, Mexico, the Russian Federation and the United States.
