

The Subcommittee began its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Colombia on behalf of the Group of the 77 and China, Nigeria on behalf of the African Group, Australia, Bahrain, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Germany, Italy, Kenya, Luxembourg, Malaysia, New Zealand, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Thailand and the United Kingdom.

## WORKING GROUP ON LEGAL ASPECTS OF SPACE RESOURCE ACTIVITIES

The Working Group held a conference this afternoon.

Welcome remarks were made by Mr. Andrzej Misztal, the chair of the Working Group on Legal Aspects of Space Resource Activities.

The first panel was on the topic of "Implications of the legal framework for space resource activities". Presentations were made by Professor of International Law at Beihang University Mr. Gao Guozhu, Professor of Space Law at the University Sapienza of Rome Mr. Sergio Marchisio, Director of Legal Affairs and Space Law at the Secure World Foundation (SWF) Mr. Christopher Johnson, Researcher at the Royal Center for Space Studies and Researches (CRERS) Mr. El Bachir Zantou, General Coordinator of International Affairs and Space Security at the Mexican Space Agency Ms. Rosa Ma. Ramírez de Arellano y Haro, Geographic Production Chief at the Istituto Geografico Militar of Ecuador Ms. Rocío Germania Narváez Benalcázar, Associate Professor of International Law at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens Mr. Georgios Kyriakopoulos, Professor of Public Law, Media Law, and Air and Space Law at the University of Potsdam Mr. Marcus Schladebach and by Head of the Multilateral Division of the International Cooperation Department at the State Space Corporation "Roscosmos" Mr. Vasily Gudnov.

The second panel was on the topic of "The role of governance, including information-sharing, in supporting space resource activities". Presentations were made by Professor at Wuhan University Institute of International Law Mr. Su Jinyuan, Assistant Professor and Deputy Director of the International Institute of Air and Spac Law at Leiden University, President emerita of the International Institute of Space Law, and Co-founder of the Hague International Space Resources Governance Working Group Ms. Tanja Masson-Zwaan, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea Mr. Konrad Marciniak, Chairman of the Technical Committee for International Scientific Cooperation, Space Council, Chairman of the Technical Committee for International Scientific Cooperation, Space Council, Russian Academy of Sciences Director of Academy of Engineering of RUDN University Mr. Yury Razoumny, Federal Attorney, Head of the Legal Department at the Brazilian Space Agency (AEB) and Chair of the Working Group on the Definition and Delimitation of Outer Space of the Legal Subcommittee Mr. Ian Grosner, Deputy CEO at the Luxembourg Space Agency Mr. Mathias Link and Director at the Cabinet Office of Japan's National Space Policy Secretariat, Mr. Ryosuke Murayama.

Representatives of Austria, Belgium, Canada, China, Greece, Indonesia, the Russian Federation, Türkiye and the United Kingdom participated in the discussion.
